Alberta Carbon Offset Program and Unharvested Crops

Agri-News recently highlighted the effects on the Alberta Carbon Offset Program if tillage occurred this spring. Tillage could be from ruts left in the field from wet conditions or fire breaks created when dealing with unharvested crops this spring. Those currently involved in the Alberta Carbon Offset Program — Conservation Tillage Protocol should know if they till 10 per cent or more of the field, that specific field won't be eligible to receive carbon offsets for the year that you tilled. Paul Jungnitsch also mentioned that you will be eligible again in the following year if you continue to direct seed and this does not affect fields that you have not tilled.
